SUMMER 2010 WORKSHOPS

1. **Intro to Theatre Jr. (ages 5-8) June 7th-11th, 8:30-11:30am**—Come learn about the theatre, from how to audition, to stage directions, & character development—all in a format your child will enjoy. Through games and activities, your child will learn to LOVE theatre.
2. **Intro to Dance (ages 13-17) June 7th-11th, 8:30-11:30am**—Tap, Jazz, whether you have two left feet or you are Mr. Bojangles come dance your way to fun with this introductory class. Learn basics as well as polished flourishes and then perform in a recital on Friday.
3. **Intro to Theatre: (ages 9-13) June 7th-11th, 3:30-6:30pm**—Come learn about the theatre, from how to audition, to stage directions, & character development—all in a format your child will enjoy. Through games and activities, your tween will learn to LOVE theatre.
4. **Imagination Station: (ages 5-8) June 14th-18th, 8:30-11:30am**—Is your child very creative? How can you direct that energy in a positive way? This class will focus on imagination, creativity and free play to create movement and whimsy.



5. **Stage Combat: (ages 13-17) June 14th-18th, 3:30-6:30pm**—Did you ever wonder how to throw a stage punch? Or how a swordfight can look so real. Come learn the basics in a safe, fun environment and then show off your skills.
6. **Page to Stage: Dr. Seuss (ages 8-13) June 21st-25th, 8:30-11:30am**—Using Dr. Seuss' beloved stories, children will create characters and dramatize several of his well-known classics.
7. **Page to Stage: Folktales (ages 5-8) June 28th-July 2nd, 8:30-11:30am**—Utilizing folktales from around the world, children will dramatize famous fables and stories that teach us how to live with one another.
8. **Page to Stage: Poetry (ages 9-13) June 28th-July 2nd, 12-3pm**—Exploring dramatic poems, children will incorporate movement and rhythm in bringing to life poems.
9. **Page to Stage: Harry Potter (ages 9-13) July 12th-16th, 8:30-11:30am**—This world renowned best seller has many smaller stories within it that we will explore, expand and execute by performing them. Come journey with us to Hogwarts and beyond!
10. **Page to Stage: Comic Books (ages 9-13) July 12th-16th, 3:30-6:30pm**—Have you ever wanted to fly faster than a speeding bullet? Well this class may be for you. Using the popular genre of superhero comic books as inspiration, children will write & act in their own adventures.
11. **Fables & Fairy Tales (ages 5-8) July 19th-23rd, 8:30-11:30am**—Taking well known classics and dramatizing them is the first step for most children in coming to know and love the theatre. This class will

teach them about creating character and working as a team on a project.

11. **Short Shakespeare (ages 9-13) July 19th-23rd, 3:30-6:30pm**—An intro to the Bard, who he was, iambic pentameter, why it's important to us today and scene work from a mix of different Shakespearean plays which the students would perform on Friday afternoon. Come discover that Shakespeare can be fun & educational!
12. **Intro to Improv (ages 9-13), July 26th-30th, 8:30-11:30am**—Is your son or daughter the next Wayne Brady? Have them discover the wonderment of improvisation, from basics and fun games, to character exploration and development. Even if your child never steps on the stage, these invaluable tools will help them think creatively and be quick on their feet!
13. **Who's Line is it Anyway? (ages 9-13), August 2nd-6th, 8:30-11:30am**—This fun and funny show uses mainly improv games to create an entire show. Come work as a team and laugh your socks off!
14. **Advanced Improv (ages 13-17), August 2nd-6th, 12-3pm**—Moving beyond short form games & utilizing long form improv "skits" made from audience suggestions.
